PERSISTENCE OF THE WIDOW'S FAITH SOUGHT JUSTICE, OUR
PERSISTENCE IN PRAYER SEEKS GOD!

We like to be treated fairly and impartially yet in our world today we might wonder if that statement is true. We have evidence of injustice all around us from judicial sentencing guidelines favouring certain ethnicities to the indiscriminate bombing of civilians in Kyiv, including tragically the death of another pregnant woman. Where was her justice? The widow's persistence in Jesus's parable paid off, but the judge only relented and gave her justice against her opponent because he was tired of being bothered by her. A somewhat flimsy reason for doing his job. The widow's justice was not due to a Godly righteousness or offering good will in God's name. Our persistence with prayer is important for us because we reinforce our faith every time we pray, alone or with another. We need prayer and learn that God is nothing like the unjust judge, which shows how much more willing God is to help us by listening and responding to our prayers. We though are not powerless widows, when we persist in prayer we are loved by God and have access to Him, thanks to Jesus. We are not turned away. Persistence in prayer equals faith. God loves to hear from us and will not tire of our repeated prayers. Jesus showed His care for women; the widow was the key character in His parable. God wants to hear from us, we can approach prayer with confidence, but we should choose to persist in faith with prayer and continue to do so because we have been invited by God.

GENESIS 32, 22 - 31

The same night he got up and took his two wives, his two maids, and his eleven children, and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. He took them and sent them across the stream, and likewise everything that he had. Jacob was left alone; and a man wrestled with him until daybreak. When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he struck him on the hip socket; and Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him. Then he said, 'Let me go, for the day is breaking.' But Jacob said, 'I will not let you go, unless you bless me.' So he said to him, 'What is your name?' And he said, 'Jacob.' Then the man said, 'You shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have striven with God and with humans, and have prevailed.' Then Jacob asked him, 'Please tell me your name.' But he said, 'Why is it that you ask my name?' And there he blessed him. So Jacob called the place Peniel, saying, 'For I have seen God face to face, and yet my life is preserved.' The sun rose upon him as he passed Penuel, limping because of his hip.

LUKE 18, 1 - 8

Jesus told the disciples a parable about their need to pray always and not to lose heart.

He said, 'In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor had respect for people. In that city there was a widow who kept coming to him and saying, "Grant me justice against my opponent." For a while he refused; but later he said to himself, "Though I have no fear of God and no respect for anyone, yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will grant her justice, so that she may not wear me out by continually coming."

And the Lord said, 'Listen to what the unjust judge says. And will not God grant justice to his chosen ones who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long in helping them? I tell you, he will quickly grant justice to them. And yet, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?'
